Food Trucks Regulations

- 1. Can only be available between 9:00 am and 8:00 pm
- 2. Cannot impede sidewalks or streets. The Village does not allow sales on its sidewalks.
- 3. Where sales are made from a vehicle, the vehicle cannot be in a stationary location in excess of 15 minutes, nor can they operate in a congested area where the operation might impede or inconvenience the public use of such streets. Any movement from the stationary location shall be to a place not less than 100 feet from such previous location and the seller shall not return to within 100 feet of any previously occupied location for at least 4 hours.
- 4. A proper health department license for a restaurant must be provided.
- 5. No seller shall allow rubbish or litter to accumulate in or around the area in which he/she is conducting business.
- 6. No seller shall make any loud noises or use any sound amplifying devices to attract customers.
- 7. If a food truck is parked on private property the property owner needs to provide written permission and the zoning needs to allow for the use. For example, a residentially zoned property could not have a food truck, as restaurants are not an allowable use in residential district. If the private property is zoned commercial, a food truck would be allowed if restaurants were listed as a permitted use.

Cost for the Peddler's Permit is a \$25 application fee and a \$5.00 per day of operation charge.
